The title should be written in “Title Case” (capitalize the first letters of all the words except the conjunctions such as “and”, “or”, “at”, “in”, “for”, “the”).

Abstract: Arial, size 9. 300 words max. The abstract should briefly state the problem or purpose of the research, explain the supported hypothesis, indicate the theoretical or experimental plan used, summarize the principle finding, point out the major conclusions, and if applicable how it fits into the designated field. Please do NOT include schemes, figures, graphs, tables, or charts. The abstract should be understandable to those outside of the designated field. The abstract page with all the information should not occupy more than one full page (1” margins: top, bottom, right and left, aligned left text). Save as a PDF titled “CAURS 2016 – Last Name.” These requirements must be strictly followed to be accepted as a CAURS 2016 presenter.
